THE EXCITEMENT

The Subud Washington DC Center was erected on December 28 and 29, 2013. You can share in the excitement by watching the <u>video</u> of the event created by DC member Harris Woodward. It was an amazing scene with many members, friends, families and neighbors coming out to watch. It was even covered in the local news.

We are still a few months from occupancy awaiting completion of geothermal, HVAC, inside finishing, electricity, doors, water connection, sidewalks, deck, and landscaping. But the joy of having the building there beckoning us is immeasurable.

THE VISION

From the beginning, the vision was to build something that the Washington DC Center could gift as a center for the broader Subud community - way beyond the local membership. Although this enormous undertaking continues to face financial and timing challenges; occupancy is on schedule for May with a grand opening to follow. The center will serve as a home for greater DC area members and will be available to host national / international Subud events and enterprises. It will also provide a home for our national office. Additional spaces will be rented for sustainability. Although donations in money and resources are still greatly needed, the

OUR VALLEY OF THE SUN: SUBUD PHOENIX

The Subud Phoenix Group includes members who live in Phoenix and the surrounding areas of Scottsdale, Fountain Hills, Chandler, Maricopa, Glendale and Sun City, Arizona. Our Valley of the Sun is spread out but close enough not to be isolated! The group is currently about 25 strong.

Recently, I asked our members to describe our group. The words they used were that our members were kind, lighthearted, sincere and humorous. I thought, "This isn't enough for writing an article." I went home, got quiet and became aware of how profound their comments were — what a beautiful group we have — the opportunity to do latihan together and the impact of the latihan on each of us. There is a commitment in our group to the latihan and a strong concern for the well being of others.

Our current excitement is the Subud Archives project headed up by Daniela Moneta. Our members have enjoyed getting together and giving a hand to Daniela in getting things prepared for a new storage facility. One of Daniela's specialties is as an archivist, and her background includes experience with the Subud Archives at Wisma Subud in Indonesia. She has also worked in Florence, Italy, with the preservation of art and writings affected by the 1966 flood of the Arno River, which killed many people and damaged or destroyed millions of masterpieces of art and rare books. The Subud Archives are stored in five areas of the world and Phoenix is currently one of the sites. The preservation includes Bapak's writings, his talks, and pictures, along with photos of members and Subud groups, congresses, gatherings and accomplishments.

The Subud Archives project is giving us opportunities to help and work together! The new storage area is ready

and 250+ boxes were recently picked up and moved in a large truck by members of our group. Daniela has the knowledge and expertise to make certain that these important materials are organized, properly stored, preserved and available for further use. ABOUT SUBUD SANTA CRUZ

Still etched in memory are the words, "Going once, going twice, SOLD to Subud California." The pounding of the gavel upon this pronouncement in 1972 was the launching of a very vital era for Subud in Santa Cruz... We, a small band of local Subud members, were the early beneficiaries of the purchase of this Spanish-style stucco school house from the Mountain Elementary School District. To this day, occasional visits to the Center by local residents, nostalgia written on their faces, tell us that they or their parents went to school here.

Some of the key people in facilitating that purchase many years ago were Lester Wong, Reynold and Halimah Bean, Haris Clemes, Marcella Respini, Arianne and Harris Strassner, and the Martins. Once this milestone was passed, the group expanded year by year until sometime in the late 70's or early 80's, the group boasted over a hundred members. Our latihans were loud and sonorous!



An early major event for us was Bapak's visit to the Center during his trip to California in 1976. It was a memorable day, preceded by many weeks of work upgrading the building's interior. A very tall Coast Redwood, a tree

indigenous to this area, stands where Bapak dug the first shovelful of dirt for its planting that day, (in photo behind Subud sign). What I remember is that Bapak was told in a small ceremony that we chose that tree because it symbolized strength and longevity. He nodded and smiled his agreement with the choice. According to Robert Goonetilleke, who may have a better memory, our then chairman Greg Hammer 'told

Bapak that the Redwood tree he planted would last forever! Bapak's comment that nothing lasts forever is something that I remember well.'

It is true that the booming days of Subud here in the 70's and 80's did not last forever. But like that tree, at least up to present time, the latihan has thrived here. Though our membership is considerably smaller now (less than 30 people), with a few members between 20 and 50 and the majority in the elder category, we hear comments from visitors that the latihan is strong and good, thank you God. We've kept it a priority to have an attractive latihan space and to keep up with House maintenance and continue making improvements. ...This past year, with the help of a loan from the Region, it was necessary to reconstruct the entire roof as it had become evident that even a small earthquake might cause it to collapse, not a reassuring thought! At the same time the noisy, antiquated heating

system was replaced and the hardwood floors were resurfaced. The result is reassuringly sturdy and put a fresh glow in both latihan halls.

There have been births, weddings, divorces, and deaths,

some celebrated (or mourned) in our beautiful House, reminding us that the only constant is change. All these people and more certainly inspire gratitude for the long and productive life of this Center.

For the last 15-20 years, we have rented our building to various groups in the area for yoga classes, dance events, ceremonial

occasions, choir and theater rehearsals, martial arts, etc. We are grateful to these groups who constitute our most extensive form of outreach and who are important to the financial well-being of the Center. Our committee, chaired by Phillip Lindstrom, and a rental subcommittee are focusing on marketing our Center. As part of this process a new and more state-of-the-art website was created: santacruz.subudcalifornia.org.

The future of our group is uncertain, as are most future happenings. Though our membership is much smaller now, the benefits of being in this Center are beyond numbers. God's grace abounds. Those of us who have spent much of our Subud life in this Center are very, very fortunate indeed.

ONGOING SICA USA WORKSHOPS

ISMAN REPORTS: We have now found the direction that best suits the needs of the members of Subud USA. We are doing workshops around the country on culture and the use of the latihan in our daily activities. This helps to deepen the members understanding about SICA and how it affects their daily life. With the guidance of Almighty God and the experience of our Board members, we are making progress for SICA-USA that everyone can see and feel as fruitful and positive. These Workshops begin with a sharing of experiences by myself and the attendees, and end with a testing session, so that each person can receive for themselves how this applies to them. This is one of the hand outs that we use:

TRUE CULTURE

This is why it is really necessary for us to awaken culture, or that culture should awaken again within us, the culture

which truly originates in the human nature and represents humankind's worship of Almighty God.

The latihan moves those who follow it in the direction of integration – the integration of outer and inner, of culture and religion. True culture and worship are one, not in any limited sectarian or formal sense, but essentially. True culture is the expression of an inner feeling that has been brought to life, and is closely related to self-knowledge and the realization of a person's true talent, made possible by the practice of the latihan...

These are excerpts from different talks by Bapak are as they appear in Rashid Lyle's book, Subud, Chapter 9: "Culture" (1983: Humanus, Tunbridge Wells, UK.) Read the complete handout HERE.

INSIDE STORY: A SICA INTERVIEW WITH BENEDICT HERRMAN

Melinda Wallis uncovers 'Inside Stories', read more at www.subud-sica.org under 'Inspirations' "... just as the vision said. This was my miracle."

Melinda to Benedict: Please give us a little bio of yourself.

I currently live in Sacramento, California. I have 3 adult children, ages 36, 35 and 31, and three grandchildren, 10, 7, and 2. I also have two step-kids (such a silly term!) 31 and 29.

I grew up in a theatrical family, so acting was a regular part of life from the beginning. My parents had their own summer theater, in

Southern Ontario, Canada, so my parents and all their friends were show biz folks. We lived in NYC most of the year, but from age 5-16 I was part of the summer theater trip in Ontario. When I was 5, I had my first part in one of my parents' summer shows, with a few lines. I got my first laugh from an audience and I was hooked! Two years later I got a small part in a TV show at age 7, and just kept getting more parts. The work just kept coming. I got quite a career going.

Can you give us an example of how guidance has affected your work life?

Here's a story for you! About 7 years ago, I was selling phone book advertising in Novato. One day I drove to Santa Cruz for latihan, where I received that I was not

permitted to limit my vision to Portland (where I lived and worked). This was a bit confusing. I hated the sales job, but my family was in Portland too. I was 55 at the time. I was recently divorced, in transition. I didn't know what that latihan message referred to.

Time passed. I lost my job and was wondering what work to do. Nothing was happening. Then I asked one day, 'What kind of work should I be doing?' I immediately saw a vision of myself driving

around, and talking to people in some kind of territory or area, and I was driving a used Subaru station wagon. I had asked for guidance, and that vision was what I got. No other clues. A couple of years later, I had used up all my savings and had no money left. I told God I was desperate, and asked for a miracle. A few weeks later I got a call from a friend who told me of a job available in the company where he works, but I'd have to move to Sacramento. I interviewed and got the job, which I still have. And so now, in my current work, I am driving around talking to people, and I am driving a used Subaru station wagon... just as the vision said. This was my miracle.

ELDERBERRY PROJECT LAUNCHED! Support for Elders

Ibu Rahayu's vision. Ibu Rahayu expressed her wish that Susila Dharma provide support to Subud Elders in need of practical or spiritual assistance in their lives. With this inspiration, Susila Dharma USA has created a project called *The Elderberry Program*, which will fall under the auspices of Subud USA before establishing its own independent non-profit 501(c)3 status. Mardiyah Tarantino, Rachael Knotz and Marilyn Schirk comprise the team that is helping to transform Ibu Rahayu's vision into reality.



We are grateful to Ibu Rahayu for lighting the flame beneath this endeavor. For those of us who are Elders, it will be comforting to know that this service exists, and for those who become Volunteers, it will be fulfilling to set foot on this natural path, enriching one another's lives > mutually rewarding for both Elders and Volunteers.

Elderberry's mission. The primary mission of Elderberry is to meet the significant and growing need within the aging Subud community in the United States, caring for members who would welcome assistance as well as reuniting and serving our elder members who may have drifted away due to illness and/or age. Elderberry will leverage Subud networks — local and regional helpers, committees and affiliates — to identify Elders in need and understand the services to provide.

Elderberry Volunteers. Volunteer Subud members will provide one-on-one support to Elders in the program (as indeed many members are already doing privately), with the hope of building long-term relationships. Volunteers may apply for monetary assistance in case of special circumstances. In addition to visits, transportation to doctors/other appointments and stores, etc., Volunteers may arrange transportation to and from latihans or make arrangements for latihan in their homes if desired. They may also need to liaise with local services and other community organizations as required. Volunteers will be matched to the Elderberry client by a regional Elderberry Board Member; conversely, if a Subud member is already aware of an Elder's need in their community, they can approach Elderberry to become part of the volunteer corp. Or, an elder Subud member can contact Elderberry to request a Volunteer. Volunteers and the Elderberry Board will work together to discuss problems, resolve issues and determine expenses for reimbursement. Ongoing needs assessments and an annual reporting process for services will be a key part of the program, as will feedback from Elders.

How Elderberry is set up. Funding for The Elderberry Program is anticipated through a grant from Susila Dharma USA. Elderberry will maintain its own books and records, and report regularly to Subud USA regarding members served, finances and overall status. The Elderberry Board will include a Director, one Board Member from each region and an ex-officio member from Subud USA. Rohana Broadnax (Subud Midwest), Liliana Williams (Subud California) and Rohanna Muth (Subud Rocky Mountains) are three tested and confirmed Board Members to date, and we hope to have Board Members in place from the other regions by 2014. We also hope to have coordinators in the centers to help coordinate Volunteer/Elder services.

How you can serve as a Volunteer. If you feel moved to help an Elder member, please contact Elderberry about becoming a Volunteer. After the usual background check and drivers license verification, you will be introduced to an Elderberry client. You will learn how to liaise with local

services and obtain legal papers you might need in some instances. Also, if you know of a Subud Elder's need in your community, don't hesitate to approach Elderberry to request a Volunteer who will meet and attend to that Elder.

Seeking a Director and additional Board Members.

Please let us know if you would like to become a Board Member from your region; (Subud South, East Coast, Pacific Islands and Pacific Northwest regions are still needed). Elderberry is also searching for a Director, and we would like to discuss this position with you if you are

SUBUD YOUTH ACTIVITIES

TEN \$1,000 GRANTS FOR YES QUEST!

A generous donor has given \$10,000 to help ten young Subud members travel to Mexico and participate in the YES Quest and the World Congress. The Quest will run for 7 days in Puebla before Congress (July 26 to August 2) and 4 days after Congress at Usaha Abadi Mulia (August 17-21). The fee for the Quest, inclusive of program, accommodation and food is \$500. If you receive a grant, that would leave \$500 toward airfare. A YES Quest training

program will occur 3 days before the Quest and one day afterward for those interested in becoming facilitators. In addition, Subud USA is offering a grant of \$500 for one young Subud person to attend the event. which will help you understand the project, its reason for existence and the interrelated nature of the problems that affect it and all of us.

REGIONAL NEWS

SUBUD SOUTH REGIONAL CONGRESS 2013

There were 19 attendees from Austin, Dallas, San Antonio, Houston and Monroe, Louisiana. It was a good gathering with Latihans and socializing. After the first morning latihan, the women tested the following *questions*:

How would my day be if I began each morning receiving "Who is

?"

How would it be for me to attend the Puebla International Congress in 2014?

May each of us feel for herself that part of self that is my soul – that was alive before I came into this world

and that will be alive after I leave this world?

May I feel how I am in this world – inner and outer – when I am living according to true guidance from my soul?

When I am in this state, how do I regard my Subud brothers and sisters?

Let each of us feel for ourselves how important we are as individuals to the Subud South Region.

With these wonderful feelings the women were able to waft along into the business meeting with calm and surrender.

BUSINESS MEETING

With Morris McClellan, Treasurer of Subud USA, we discussed the pledge drive and annual census. Morris suggested that the regions adopt a pledge system. There is a shortfall in the national budget. Subud South does not contribute as a region, although many members send contributions directly to the national office.

Subud USA is considering a new data base which would include convention processing and be available to regions and centers as well. SUSA is also working on a change of IRS status to faith-based rather than just non-profit due to



the increasing paperwork and difficulties with our present status.

Morris reported that about 1/3 of the emails sent out by SUSA are opened.

A workshop on attracting new members was led by Elisa Sunflower.

HOUSE FUND

Harris Boebel described the history of the Housing Fund which is currently managed by the Austin group and holds about \$26,000. No one has any ideas, proposals, or plans as to how to use it. A spirited discussion ensued with no decision made to change the

status of the account.

NEW OFFICERS

Rosina Newton, Regional Helper from the Austin Group, was tested and elected unanimously for Subud South Regional Chair. Deborah Charnes, San Antonio Group, was tested and elected unanimously for Subud South Vice-Chair and John Schoenthaler, Dallas group, will be Treasurer for the coming term. Rochana Cash was tested in as Regional Helper to fulfill the place left by Rosina.

REGIONAL HELPER REPORT

Harris Boebel delivered a report of the membership which was less than positive with declining membership in the major groups of Austin, Dallas, and Houston. (Read his Helper Report on page 19.) Austin has barely any men and currently only one latihan a week. Although Austin was quick to respond that we are looking for a new meeting place to return to two latihans a week. Dallas has lost members and doesn't have two latihans a week. Houston is down as well.

Alexandra Boyer and Humphrey Williams, National Helpers, gave invaluable help with their time, attention, testing, and awesome quiet!

Elisa Sunflower has been contacting regional women members. Discussions amongst members and helpers at congress revealed that there were no groups in Subud South presently offering two latihans a week. So the regional helpers Rochana Cash, Elisa Sunflower, Harris Boebel and Sylvan Schurwanz, later conferred and agreed to offer weekly rather than monthly latihan to serve the regional members and the members in groups who want a second latihan.

SUBUD CALIFORNIA REGIONAL COUNCIL MEETING

Subud California had a three day Regional council meeting in Marin in January. We had three really productive days of meetings including a short meeting with the members of the Marin group. On Friday afternoon, a small delegation of council members and a national helper, Aminah Herrman (formerly Ulmer) met with some of the members of the Sonoma Center at their hall to discuss their property issues. They joined us on Saturday to be a part of a region-wide committee on housing and property management.

There was a lovely 3rd night Selamatan for Rochanah Weissinger on Saturday night with prayers from the Christian, Jewish and Islamic faiths, singing and silence. We had a lovely dinner of her favorite foods - Indonesian and chocolate!

NATIONAL NEWS

WHAT HAS THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE BEEN DOING?

- 1. CRM SOFTWARE (Customer / Constituent Management): Subud USA just signed a contract with Neon for this online software package. This is a cloud-based system and will be available on anyone's computer via the internet. In addition to being a secure site, it is only accessible by logins, passwords, and verification codes. The software will enable Subud USA to integrate our membership database with our annual pledge drive, event registration (such as national and regional congresses), email communication such as our e-blast, storage of documents, and creation of forms and surveys. Its fundraising and event registration modules will synchronize with our Quickbooks accounting software.
- 2. 2014 NATIONAL CONGRESS: We have signed a contract with Robert Morris University in Pittsburgh to host our Memorial Day National Congress. Thursday, May 22 is a kejiwaan day and Friday through Monday morning, May 23 26 are for the business congress, non-business workshops, entertainment, and latihans. We are also in the midst of signing a contact with the Hampton Inn, a nearby hotel with shuttle service to and from the airport and to and from the university. Both the university and the hotel are very close to the Pittsburgh airport.
- 3. NEW OFFICERS SELECTED IN 2014: Every two years, at the Subud USA National Congress, a new slate of officers is selected: chair, vice chair, and committee councilor. Also needed are chairs for Subud Enterprise Services (SES) and Subud Youth (and Family) Activities, Chairs of SD and SICA USA are serving three-year-terms until 2015. Once the Subud USA chair is selected, he or she will choose a secretary and treasurer. Job descriptions for some of these positions can be found on the subudusa website (SubudUSA.org) by clicking 'Members Page' at the top of the home page, then under 'Governance' click on 'Committee'> 'Committee Material'.
- 4. 2015 NATIONAL GATHERING: We have signed a contract with the Sofitel Hotel San Francisco (in Redwood City) for our National Gathering to be held over Labor Day weekend in September of 2015. This is the same venue used by Subud California for their

2013 Congress. The Subud USA Board voted that the national committee should attempt to secure venues for three successive gatherings so we have a better chance of finding the best venues.

- 5. ARCHIVES: The Subud USA Archives along with World Subud Association archives have been housed at Iron Mountain Storage facility in Phoenix for many years. Because of greatly increased rent and fees, it is now being moved to a much less expensive storage facility. See the article on archives on page 14.
- 6. 2013 CENSUS: All centers, groups, and regions have returned the forms sent to them asking for updated membership and center information. The results show that we have an active membership of 1715, of whom 65 are new members. This includes active, semi-active, and occasional members. There are 157 members who became inactive during the past year those who no longer do latihan, have resigned, or cannot be reached. Nine additional members died during the year.

7. DELEGATES FOR THE 2014 NATIONAL CONGRESS: The table below shows the number of delegates apportioned to each region based only on active and semi-active members. Not included in the count are those who come occasionally, such as once a year. There are an additional 11 delegates: 7 regional chairs, 1 national committee, 3 national wings/affiliates. Contact your regional chair or representative if interested in serving in this role.

- 8. MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY: We are currently working on a 2014 membership directory based on the information we received in the census. Similarly to last year, we will have this online free-of-charge for all members with valid email addresses. For those who wish, we will offer paper copies for a small charge.
- SUBUD USA ENDOWMENT FUND: Since Deliana Fuddy's term as chair of Subud USA (2006-8), we have been steadily growing the endowment fund she began.

The policy stipulates that none of the earnings (dividends and interest) can be used until the fund reaches \$250,000. Because of generous member donations and bequests, we have reached this milestone. At the end of this fiscal year, December 2014, the Subud USA Board of Directors will vote on whether to use the dividends or reinvest them to further grow the fund.

10. PLEDGE DRIVE: We are still following up on our end-of-year annual membership pledge drive, so do not have a final count on the

amount of contributions received.

ENDOWMENT FUND REACHES MILESTONE!

Because of a recent bequest and contributions on behalf of Deliana to our permanently restricted Subud USA Endowment Fund, we have now surpassed our first objective, to reach \$250,000. According to our endowment policy, 'no dividends shall be used until a minimum principal sum of \$250,000 is established in the Fund'. At the end of 2014, the board of directors can decide whether to reinvest those dividends in the endowment or use them to fund projects and activities of Subud USA.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF BAPAK'S WRITTEN ARCHIVES

1986 TO THE PRESENT

"That is why I have explained that the archives are the source for Subud. They should be preserved for all time, because as long as we have the archives and they are professionally managed, Subud will not lose its source." 13 CDK 2. Ibu Rahayu's Explanations during WSHPP Meeting, 30 Jul 2013

Bapak left behind a vast number of documents including his writings and publications, his correspondence with Subud members, his interaction with the organizational and kejiwaan sides of Subud, talks, messages to congresses, and much more. From 1956 to 1986 when Subud began to spread in the world, Bapak received thousands of letters from Subud members asking for advice on spiritual and worldly matters. Approximately 84,000 letters were received during this thirty-year period. These letters make up the bulk of the material in the WSA International Archives at Wisma Subud, in Jakarta, Indonesia. Since Bapak's passing, Ibu Rahayu has taken on much of the responsibility of answering members' questions and advising on spiritual matters. Original papers and now many digital files are being collected and preserved; these documents represent the history of our Subud organization. Historians tell us that it is critical to preserve the first fifty years of any major organization or movement. Bapak did an excellent job of preserving the first thirty years but since his passing, we have some major catching up to do to preserve the history of our organization from 1986 to 2006 and beyond.

Bapak passed away in June 1986. Harris Roberts and his mother Aishah Roberts, who lived at Wisma Subud, traveled around the world at the beginning of 1987 visiting Subud centers telling members that Bapak's Archives were in danger of being lost. They came to Subud Los Angeles where Daniela Moneta lived at the time; she was moved to become involved in the rescue of these archives. Daniela was a paper conservator; she had previously worked restoring books and documents in Italy for the Biblioteca Nationale Centrale and the Italian State Archives from 1967 to 1973 and had a Masters Degree in Library and Information Science from UCLA (1980) with specialization in Archives Management. Daniela gave a presentation at the Subud California National Congress in the summer of 1988 about how to rescue the Subud archives in Indonesia. Lorenzo Music attended the presentation and agreed to

form a committee and be the fundraiser. Daniela began working on a detailed plan to purchase equipment and supplies for the Indonesian Archives and agreed to eventually leave her job as archivist for the Southwest Museum in Los Angeles to work in Indonesia. Fundraising for this project continued until the Colombian World Congress in 1993 when the first major step in preserving Bapak's written archives was completed.

In January 1989, Daniela attended the 8th World Congress at Sydney, Australia, where it was decided by the World Subud Association (WSA) to form five Subud Archives International (SAI) locations, these being Indonesia, England, Japan, Australia, and the United States. She combined this trip to the World Congress with a three-

week stopover in Indonesia to make an inventory of the collection and take measurements. She met with the Subud Archives International committee at the time consisting of Harlinah Longcroft, Harris Roberts, Pak Widarbo, and other Indonesians to plan for the preservation of Bapak's Archives, all of which were to remain in Indonesia.

Daniela created an archival numbering system for all Subud documents that could be used in all of the SAI centers. She purchased the equipment needed to arrange, preserve, and provide access to Bapak's Archives... She

began investigating the best options for de-acidifying the handwritten documents by Bapak on very acidic newsprint paper that were quickly deteriorating. The supplies and equipment were paid for by the fundraising efforts of Lorenzo and Henrietta Music and Ruslan Moore.

In June 1989, Daniela arrived at the Subud compound, Wisma Subud, in Jakarta, Indonesia, and worked full-time toward the completion of archiving all of Bapak's materials until July 1993, ending at the 9th Subud World Congress in Colombia. During this time she trained six Indonesian staff and several volunteers to help with the work, reported regularly to the International Subud Committee (ISC) on progress, wrote articles about the project, and worked with the fundraising team to support the project. ...She finalized the plan to preserve Bapak's handwritten documents on newsprint paper and had equipment shipped to Jakarta from the National Archives of Canada to de-acidify the thousands of papers in the collection. This work was completed in 1994.

During the last year and a half of Daniela's stay in Indonesia, there were two major floods at the P.T. S. Widjojo Bank building involving their archives which had been stored in the basement of the building. Daniela and her staff rescued the Widjojo collection two times by removing and drying it. After the second flood, she arranged to have selected documents moved to the Archives at Wisma Subud. This was an important collection of approximately a quarter million items.

The WSA continues to maintain five SAI locations for the microfilm; the Indonesian Archive location continues to hold Bapak's and Ibu Rahayu's original documents and the Australian Archive holds the majority of all other international materials, including those for writing the history of Subud. While preserving Bapak's writings was successfully completed, since 2012 ambitious efforts to preserve the remaining 1,300 original recordings of Bapak's talks have been underway as 'The Legacy Project' and, indeed, both projects form major parts of Subud's legacy.

Daniela continues to work as the volunteer coordinator in the Subud USA national and WSA international archives in the U.S. This includes collecting and preserving Subud documents in Area III covering Zones 7, 8, and 9 (the Americas). She is also working on a full-text electronic version of the microfiche set of Bapak's advice and receives a small stipend for special international archives

CARING FOR OUR LEGACY Subud USA and International Archives

For many years the Subud USA and US collection of Subud Archives International (SAI) have been stored at 'Iron Mountain' in Phoenix, but costs escalated and the facility was less than adequate. Daniela identified a new storage facility that will better serve our needs and began moving all the archive material with the help of the Phoenix Subud group. Marie Jeffers, Hartati Ramsey and Latief Dewes are volunteering in the archives once a week and will help with sorting and inventorying the collection and preparing it for indexing in the Subud Archives database.

The U.S. collection contains about 225 linear feet of material including organizational and kejiwaan papers, books and periodicals, photographs, and personal manuscripts and journals by Subud members. This collection is being reorganized into acid-free boxes and folders and an electronic index is being created. WSA is funding materials for the international collection and Subud USA must fund the storage costs, shelving and archival boxes for our collection. This is a new expense for Subud USA, as the bequest left by Lorenzo Music has almost run out.

The members' site has five tabs: Members, Subud USA, Governance, Community and Directory Login. The 'Subud USA' and 'Governance' tabs include information for

2013 YEAR END FINANCIAL REPORT TREASURER'S COMMENTS

The "Actual" column is the final numbers for 2013, the "Budget" is what we projected at the beginning of the year, and the "Variance" column presents the difference between what we budgeted and how it all came out. Despite donations being much lower than planned, we managed to come out of 2013 in pretty good shape.

The combined endowment has now gone over the \$250K threshold. It doesn't mean we can immediately use any profits from the fund; that will be decided by the Board at the end of the year. It is an accomplishment, however, worthy of a moment of gratitude and celebration.

This link (for lack of space) shows a summary of our balance sheet, what we own and owe, as of the end of 2013. In addition to the endowment funds mentioned, we ended the year with a net of \$28,368 in general fund reserves. We also hold several other special-purpose funds, including \$117,228 in housing funds (of which \$105,962 is currently loaned out to 3 centers) and funds for SES, SYA, archives, and care support.

AS FOR SUBUD SOUTH...

Despite temporary increases in membership in both groups the overall tendency has been decline in membership... The reason for this decline to my mind is the inability of helpers and committees to embrace their responsibilities as outlined by Bapak throughout his life with us. In the end he told us we had made progress but lacked courage. As a longtime helper, I found that to be true of myself, so what I am saying applies to me as well.

Firstly, he said the strength of the group, its latihan and the bonding of the members into a community, a family, is the responsibility of the helpers, and if the helpers dewan was not unified and harmonious, then neither could the members be. And he often pointed out that the two dewans must be harmonious as well. We must learn to

truly love one another and love ourselves in order to demonstrate Subud, or we cannot attract new members.

Secondly, Bapak advised the Committees that their responsibilities were to find the money and the premises for latihan and attendant activities. Included in this was the admonition to start and foster enterprises so that the center members could learn to work with each other, take care of each other, and love one another. This is a heavy load.

Conclusion. He never said it would be easy. We assumed it was, and the world has grown so seductive materially, with an incredible increase in information and media possibilities, that if we have a job, car, home, TV and crazy phones, we are captivated by this world, unable to resist and unaware that Subud and the latihan is our primary concern. Bapak spoke about the 'bad' angels and their intent to mislead us and prevent us from returning to our original state. I believe they are very active, and very successful.

A: It is tropical, in other words sunny and warm but with rainstorms usually in the afternoon. Bring a light rain coat.

Q: I have heard Puebla is high up, what are the health incidences?

A: Effectively Puebla is at 2.100 meters or about 7.000 feet. Puebla is on a plateau and on the horizon you see Popocateptl looming up to 5.000 meters, so the effect is not quite like when you climb a mountain. Still normal people may feel mildly out of breath if one runs or when walking up a hill. It would be recommended that anyone with a heart condition, though, consult their doctor.

 The Zone Reps are members of the World Subud Council, along with the Wing Representatives and International Helpers. The role of the Council is to carry out the resolutions, business and wishes of World Congress between Congresses.

Please consider the position. The Kejiwaan Councillors have recommended that applicants pre-test: "Is it right for (name) to put his/her name forward to stand for the position of Zone 7 Rep for the coming term?" You can contact me by email, dave_hitchcock@shaw.ca, or phone in Canada 250 370-1291.

All applications should be sent to the respective National Committees by March 31, 2014. The final selection will be made at Puebla, and it is hoped that most of the applicants can be present, although this isn't mandatory.

I am a member of the World Congress Program Planning Team. This group of 14 has been working hard in developing a program framework for the World Congress in Puebla. There is very good representation from Zone 7 on this team, as it also includes Latifah Taormina, Rashad Pollard (USA), Kumari Beck, Luqman Penseney, Grace Hodgson, Hamilton Schragen (Canada), and Mariamah Flores, Fernando Fatah (Mexico). ... Subud members have an opportunity to offer workshops when they register for the Congress and it is expected that a further request will go out soon. In addition, national committees have been invited to submit resolutions / proposals for discussion and voting at the Plenary Session. (See related article on page 21.)

If you have any specific suggestions for the organization of the upcoming Congress, please pass them on to me and I will forward them.

National committees recently received a letter from the WSA Executive about 'WSA Country Membership'... to review the criteria and responsibilities of WSA membership. Most recently I have been working with our Zone 7 Cuba Committee to ensure that we do all that is practically and financially possible to assist the Cuban delegates to get to the World Congress. We are hoping that at least 5 Cubans can attend.

WSA ORGANIZATION WORKING GROUP

At the 2010 Christchurch World Congress, one resolution called to establish an Organizational Working Group to examine the organizational health of the World Subud Association. The three main focus areas are: (1) The Aims of the WSA, (2) The Elements, Organs, Bodies of the WSA, and (3) The Decision Making Process.

The World Subud Council formed a Working Group and two Advisory Sub Groups, one Spanish speaking and the other English speaking. Rasjidah Franklin is participating in the English speaking group, as are Kumari Beck and Dave Hitchcock. The resolution on WSA Country Membership is the first issue the Working Group will review.

WSA CHAIR REVIEW, Quarters 3 -4, 2013

World Subud Association (WSA) Chairperson, Luqman Penseney, sends periodic reports based on his experiences in our global community. Here are excerpts from his most recent, which you may in full HERE.

IBU AND WORLD CONGRESS: We had always anticipated that Ibu's health might prevent her from attending World Congress, so the WCOT team has been planning for both eventualities. Then in early September Muti contacted Maxwell and I on behalf of Ibu saying that Ibu's recent health issues had indicated to her that she could not attend Congress. We felt disappointed, but also sense the challenge to take responsibility now for our own Congress...coming together to explore our Subud culture in all its manifestations. Nevertheless Ibu plans on making talks for us to see/hear on video during the Congress. The

Congress content teams plan on providing Bapak Talks Venues/evenings etc.

YOUTH TO CONGRESS: With perhaps 12-13000 active members worldwide, we may have 2000 younger members under the age of 30-35. These and those who are attracted to Subud through them, are part of the future of Subud; we neglect them at our peril..! Some are from less wealthy countries with a large memberships, like Indonesia (4000+ members), Colombia (500 members)... but also USA (2000 members), Britain (1200), Canada (350), Australia (450), Germany (400) etc. who although wealthier countries, still need support and encouragement for their younger members to attend; to be present at this our greatest event-gathering in Subud now that Bapak is no longer with us.

MY STORY AND THE EARLY DAYS

by Harun Taormina, '...this is what I had been looking for since the day I came out of the womb'

God, there has to be something else!

By the time I was thirty-five, I had a nightclub in San Francisco, an apartment in one of the city's great old mansions, a redheaded girlfriend, and a life that was one big roller coaster ride. High one minute, low the next, pain, jealousy, insecurity. Everywhere I looked people were just feeding off each other, using each other for their own gain. There was absolutely no reality. It was 1957. Life was the shits, and getting high was my only refuge.

But the truth is I'd been turned off by how the world was since childhood. Maybe because I wasn't wanted in the first place. My parents were Italian immigrants who thought they were finished with children when I came along. My mother had already borne 12 children. So when she discovered she was pregnant, she was very disappointed. Not another child. And there was the language, too. My parents didn't speak English. Very little. My older brothers and sisters could understand them, but by the time I came, there was so much English in the house, I didn't learn Italian. I could understand it, but not speak it. So from the beginning, things didn't really fit. I didn't feel I belonged anywhere.

I'd look for places to belong. I used to think there were connections with the kids in my neighborhood. With anything that didn't have to do with school. Although I do remember going to catechism as a kid — and loving it — because of all the stories the nuns told about Jesus and the saints. I always left my catechism classes with a wonderful feeling. But as soon as I was back out on the streets, those feelings would evaporate and the stories would seem like fairy tales. The people I knew weren't like that at all. It was as if I'd been shown the parts of a clock without being shown how the clock worked.

So now nothing made sense, nothing connected. That's why I ended up deciding to follow whatever interested me. Of course, that's like a man riding shotgun on a stagecoach when no one has hold of the reins. What interested me was tuning out what didn't make sense. Marijuana became my passion, and my habit. Funny thing though, I never got high in the daytime. Only at night.

Right around this time, Laura, my girl friend and a follower of the Gurdjieff-Ouspensky work, came into the club to show me a card she'd just received from the George Field Book Store in San Francisco. This card announced a series of special informational talks by John Bennett... On this occasion, Bennett was going to give a talk about this new movement in the world called "Subud." And he would also be introducing a man from the East who was connected to Subud, someone they all called Pak Subuh, or "Bapak". Laura commented that she had also heard that Gurdjieff, before he died, predicted the coming of a man from the East who would be able to take inner development to another level. When I heard this, I started to cry. My own life had reached the point where I felt that if this were life, I might as well be dead. I knew I had to meet this Mr. Bennett.

...On the night of the talk, he came out on stage with a huge black board with the Subud symbol drawn in chalk. He bowed his head and shut his eyes. He stayed this way so long I began to wonder if he had died...<u>Read Harun's complete story</u>.

SPIRITUAL TALES FROM DIKRAN GARABEDIAN

Regional Member from Roswell, New Mexico

A Talk with Rohanna Muth

Dikran was raised in Salinas, California, and memories of his early life are, in great part, vividly spiritual. From the beginning, he sought the spiritual life and ultimately became a world traveler who trekked to Europe, Asia and North Africa, not only seeking adventure but searching to fulfill his destiny.

When Dikran (then Gary) was 19, his father, a chiropractor and enlightened soul, recognized his son's inner turmoil and quest for the spiritual life. (Years later after he was opened, Dikran discovered

the book, *Concerning Subud*, in his father's library.) Dr. Martin sent his son to visit a friend and patient, Will Eddy, a 92-year-old nephew of Mary Baker Eddy who founded the Christian Science religion in the 19th century. Will was almost blind due to his participation in developing the X-ray before the effects of radiation were known. His house was like a museum, with mementos and photos of his world travels, along with an immense library of books. Will had gained strong spiritual wisdom as a student of metaphysics for over 70 years. Dikran would read to the old man. Will Eddy shared his deep experiences with fasting and prayer, which became an integral part of Dikran's life.

In 1972, 22-year-old Dikran spent a year on the Mediterranean island of Formentera, between Spain and North Africa. One day while making a phone call in a small public room, a man appeared in the doorway. Their eyes met and a silent, meaningful interchange took place. Ronimund von Bissing (author of Songs of Submission, a poetic book about the latihan) asked the young man if he needed help since Dikran spoke no Spanish.

Ronimund then asked, "Do you follow a way?" Dikran nodded, "Yes."

Ronimund replied, "Would you like to come to dinner?"



Within a few months, Dikran was living, and working at the Von Bissing's Hotel. It was there that he was opened and began his journey in Subud.

Dikran returned to Salinas several years later where he started his own electronics company specializing in video repair. It was there that he met his wife, Betty, also a Subud member and registered nurse. They eventually bought a motor coach and toured the country for over seven years, often volunteering their services in state parks in exchange for their space. Eventually, Betty wanted a home once again and they chose Roswell, New Mexico, for its small

population, favorable climate and somewhat isolated location. Betty, with over 40 years' experience, still returns to Salinas to carry out per diem work as a recovery nurse. They have spent the last five years remodeling and enjoying their home, yet they look forward to once again taking up the nomadic life in their motor coach to visit Subud groups and places not yet seen.

When Dikran's grandparents came to the US from Armenia, their surname of Garabedian was changed to Martin. Dikran explained that his first name was given to him by Bapak during one of his visits to Indonesia; it is an Armenian name.

A three-year-old Dikran told his parents that he wanted to change his name when he got older. "Maybe my ancestors were pushing! So my parents weren't surprised when I ultimately changed from Gary Martin to Dikran Garabedian," he laughs softly.

Dikran urges new members and regional members in particular to not put off doing latihan on a regular basis. "It can sometimes be difficult to feel motivated, but as 'essence' begins to overcome ego and its constituents, those forces wane in their in their influence on one. Light fills where once there was darkness; the subtleties of resistance continually lessen."

Longtime Subud member and artist/sculptor, Sal Brownfield, recently created a series of portraits of men and women who have survived breast cancer titled "Sal Brownfield: A Celebration of Healing," which were on display through December 28th at the Hudgens Center for the Arts in Duluth, near Atlanta, Georgia. Writer Eve Hoffman included a



written story to accompany each painting in this powerful project. As Sal captured the essence of his subjects on canvas, he came to know their individual stories and realized they also needed to be expressed in writing. REMEMBERING

DELIANA LORETTA FUDDY

from the Subud USA National Committee

Our dear sister, Deliana Loretta Fuddy, died in a plane crash on Wednesday, December 11, 2013, one half mile off the coast of Molokai, Hawaii. She was 65 years old.

The plane was en route to Honolulu. Many of us knew Deliana as the Chairperson of Subud USA from 2006 to 2008.



A small plane carrying nine people (a pilot and eight passengers) had engine failure and crashed into the water. Deliana, who was director of the state Department of Health since January, 2011, was killed. The other eight survived.

The passengers were returning from their annual visit to Kalaupapa, a remote peninsula on the north side of Molokai. Hawaii exiled people with leprosy or Hansen's disease to Kalaupapa from 1866 through 1969. Some are still living there today. Deliana, in her role as director of the health department, was appointed mayor of this community.

Deliana became known for, among other things, verifying the authenticity of President Obama's birth certificate. Senator Josh Green, chairman of the committee on health, said "It's so appropriate that just yesterday the stories broke that Hawaii was number one in health again for the country, and I think director Fuddy deserves the credit for that." Death is usually felt and thought to be a threat, the ultimate threat. For once we are dead it is impossible for us to live any more. Once a person is dead the story of his life in this world is over. But It is God's will for humankind, whom He created, that death should not be a threat or something perilous for their life. On the contrary, God wills that death should be a channel, a continuation for human beings, so they can continue the life of their inner feeling, a life of glory and unlimited happiness; that is, if the human being is aware of it, if they have received God's will, which has been created within their being and which is usually said to be written within a human being's chest, being the structure for their life.
